10 Paise coins were minted from 1957 -1998 and can be categorised into 6 different varieties as under

CoinXpress

- * 1957 63: 10 Naye Paise Copper Nickel
- * 1964 67: 10 Paise Copper Nickel
- 1968 71: 10 Paise Aluminium Bronze
- ✤ 1971 82: 10 Paise Big Planchet Aluminium Magnesium
- ✤ 1983 93: 10 Paise Small Planchet Aluminium Magnesium
- * 1988 98: 10 Paise Stainless Steel

Please Note : In 1971 and between 1988-93 two different varieties of 10 Paise Coins were minted simultaneously.

10 paise coins minted from 1957 to 1967 are almost similar to 5 paise copper nickel coins i.e., as decimal series started from 1957, so 1957 to 1963 Naye Paise, from 1964 - 1967 word "Naye" dropped and from 1968 the metal was changed.

* 1957 - 63: 10 Naye Paise Copper Nickel

On the obverse of these coins we can see the Lion Capital of Ashoka in the centre surrounded by the Legend "Bharat" and "India" towards the left and right respectively. On the reverse side of the coin the denomination "10" is inscribed in the centre surrounded by the text "Rupay ka Daswa Bhaag" on the circumference in Devanagari. On the coins minted from 1957 to 1963 the text "Naye Paise" is written just below the denomination and the year of minting below that. As usual the mint mark is below the year of minting.





* 1964 - 67: 10 Paise Copper Nickel

On the coins minted from 1964 to 1967 the word "Naye" was dropped and it was replaced by the denomination "Das" in Devanagari. Other than this, these 10 Paise coins minted from 1964-67 were similar to the coins minted from 1957-63.

✤ 1968 - 71: 10 Paise Aluminium Bronze

Both the obverse and reverse of the coin remains the same, however the planchet used was changed from Copper- Nickel to Aluminium Bronze i.e. other than change in planchet the 10 paise coins minted from 1968 to 1971 were similar to coins minted from 1964 to 1967.

Did you know: People mistook its golden colour and lustre for the presence of gold and hence started melting them. Consequently, these were called in from circulation effective October 1971.

1971 - 82: 10 Paise Big Planchet Aluminium Magnesium

Both the obverse and reverse of the coin can be divided into 2 parts. The circumference or the periphery consists of an exquisite floral design. The inner area is separated from the floral inscriptions by an engraved circle formed off 50 dots.

On the obverse of these coins, we can see the Lion Capital of Ashoka in the centre surrounded by the Legend "Bharat" and "India" towards the left and right respectively inside the inner area. The inscription on the reverse of the coin was changed. The legend "Rupay ka Daswa Bhaag" was replaced by 'Paise' in English inscribed to the right and 'Paise' in Devanagari inscribed to the left of the denomination. Moreover, the legend "das paise" below the denomination was also removed. The year of minting as usual is below the denomination and the mint mark is below the year.

✤ 1983 - 93: 10 Paise Small Planchet Aluminium Magnesium

As the prices of the metals were increasing the diameter was reduced from 26mm to 23mm consequently reducing the weight from 2.30 gms to 1.75 gms. The floral design on the periphery was removed.

The obverse of the coin remained the same however the word " Satyamev Jayate " was added to the obverse just below the Lion Capital of Ashoka. On the reverse of the coin the denomination 10 was inscribed in the centre with "Paise" in Devanagari above and "Paise" in English below the denomination. Curved lines to the left and right of the denomination were added for beautification. The year of minting was written below the inscription Paise in English and the Mint mark as usual was below the year.

Point to Note: Although the Noida mint was established in 1988, no Aluminium-Magnesium planchet coins of any denomination have been minted by the Noida mint.

* 1988 - 98: 10 Paise Stainless Steel

The sixth and last variety of 10 paise coins were minted in stainless steel which was used for the first time to mint coins. The obverse of the coin remained the same however the reverse was changed. The denomination '10' remained inscribed in the centre of the reverse however the text 'Paise' in Devanagari which was previously above the Numeral was shifted to the upper left periphery and 'Paise' in English which was previously below the numeral was shifted to the upper right periphery/circumference. The year of minting was below the numeral and as usual the mint mark was below the year.
